LETTER FROM THE RECTORY



The lights are packed away; the trees have long since been shredded; the decorations are back in boxes. Although the days are getting longer the hope of light and warmth is still faint; it takes time for light to transform the darkness.

But February brings its own light! The Christmas and Epiphany season comes to an end at Candlemas on 2 February, the commemoration of the *Presentation of our Lord in the Temple*: the baby Jesus was brought to the Temple to be dedicated to

God and was recognised by the elderly Simeon and Anna as the “light of the Gentiles,” a light for all peoples, all nations. We will celebrate this feast in Ashton and in Christow at our 10.30am services on Sunday 1 February. Traditionally on this day people would bring their candles, together with all the church candles, to be blessed in the name of Jesus, Light of the World – why not bring a candle with you for a blessing?

Lent starts early this year as we commence our annual six-week pilgrimage towards Easter; on Ash Wednesday, 18 Feb, we will hold a service of *Holy Communion and Imposition of Ashes* at 6pm at St James’s, Christow. The ash cross on our foreheads reminds us that one day we will return to the earth, the ground of our beginning. During Lent we ponder how best we should spend the rest of our time on this earth in preparation for the meeting with our Redeemer and Judge.

We explore this in our Lent course on the following Wednesdays, starting 25 February, as we watch episodes of *The Chosen* to discern how and why God has chosen *us*, and what that means for *our* lives. For details, please see the poster later in *Unity*. The Monday Lent lunches begin in Dunsford on 23 February at 12.45pm in the Village Hall Dressing Room. Come and share a soup lunch with a short 10-minute talk from different members of our community.

Bringing Back Pine Martens

Reintroducing a key member of the woodland family



Shillingford Wildlife Group presents a talk by
Devon Wildlife Trusts Daniel Brown,
at Shillingford Village Hall on February 9th at 7.30.

Daniel is the Devon Wildlife Trusts Two Moors Pine Marten Project Officer and has been one of the key members in the DWT team helping in the reintroduction of the Pine Martens to Devon. The animal has been extinct in Devon for more than 150 years, but now that it is back it is hoped to help restore a natural balance back into Devon's wildlife.

Pine Martens Return

Shy, curious and playful. The pine marten is a stealthy, acrobatic hunter that relies on the cover of woods and trees for its foraging missions. It was once a fundamental part of our woodlands, but it is now critically endangered in England and Wales. As a result, we risk losing a beautiful, fascinating wild creature that plays a key role in the health of our woodlands.

Pine Martens Bounce Back: The Two Moors project aims to reintroduce pine martens to Dartmoor and Exmoor helping to restore natural balance to our much loved woodlands and bringing back these fascinating wild creatures to the landscapes where they once belonged. The return of pine martens to this area will be a positive step in restoring the fortunes of local wildlife at a time when it faces huge challenges.



A short resume of the last Shillingford parish meeting

The damaged pavement on the corner of Ilex Close is still awaiting Highways attention. This is to be followed up.

The chairman voiced his concern that in spite of an agreement with Teign Housing having been agreed, the PC is not always being notified of vacant properties in SSG, but only when they are about to be advertised. This is to be followed up.

The chairman has approached one of the Trustees of the Village Green in the hope that there could be an informal meeting with the remaining four Trustees. He awaits a response to this request.

The Local Government reorganisation is still proposed with various options on the table. This decision is now with the Government with the final decision being made this summer. There is still much confusion and uncertainty surrounding this topic. Devon is a difficult county to split up logically one reason being its size.

Teignbridge councillors will be trying to do their best for the final two years of their authority.

There is to be a **“fake fly tip”** at Haldon Forest car park on 21st January arranged by TDC and the police. This is aiming to raise awareness and publicity for this unlawful act.

Neighbourhood Development Plan.

The previous meeting was cancelled at short notice due to adverse weather conditions. There will be another meeting arranged soon and the date circulated.

A recent Cluster meeting was hosted by Shillingford with four neighbouring parishes represented. A useful discussion and exchange of ideas ensued.

The Annual Litter Pick. This is to be arranged for the 28th February, more information will be posted.

Potholes in Markhams Lane, Manstree Lane and a blocked drain also in Manstree Lane are to be reported.

Next PC meeting is to be held on Monday 9th March in the Village Hall.

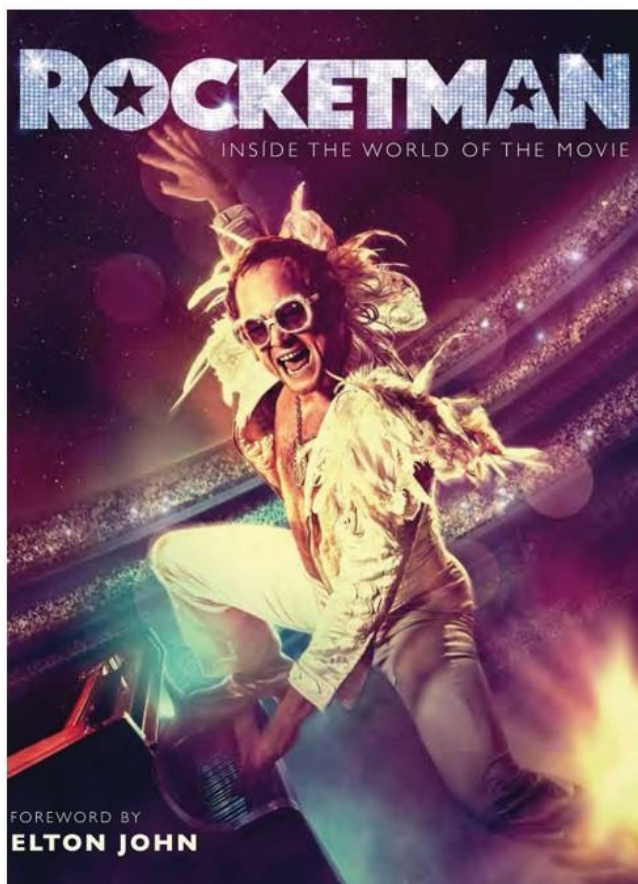

700

My friend looked so happy. I'm going to get £700 compensation for each of my cars! I thought about how disappointed they would look when I told them they will **not** get £700 because that is **not how averages work**.



Imagine there are four of us who got compensation. I got £100, you got £200, he got £300 and she got £2200. To work out the average, we add these up (= £2800) and divide by four (because there are four of us). We get $2800 \div 4 = 700$. The *average* compensation is £700 but notice, no-one actually got £700. Three of us got a lot less and one of us got mega-pounds more.

So if the average doesn't tell you what you will get, what is the point of working it out? Is its existence just so the marketing department can fool us into thinking we're going to get something we're not?

Averages are most useful for comparisons. For example, compare average rainfall in February:

Exeter Airport 65mm	Greenwich Observatory, London 40mm
Princetown 73mm	South West of Britain 104.5mm

You can quickly see here that generally Princetown is wetter than Exeter and Greenwich is drier.

Look at the Met Office data for the South West: in the last 190 years only one February (in 2001) had the average 104.8 mm of rain. No other years had the average rainfall, they varied dramatically anywhere between 1.9mm and 248mm. The average is useful for *comparison* with other years and other places, it doesn't tell you what will happen this year.

This February the South West will not have 104mm of rain and, back to car finance compensation, with one or two exceptions no-one will get the average of £700.

This promises to be a fascinating afternoon, offering a different historical focus from our usual Dunchideock history programme. Dr Trethewey is an **award-winning author**.

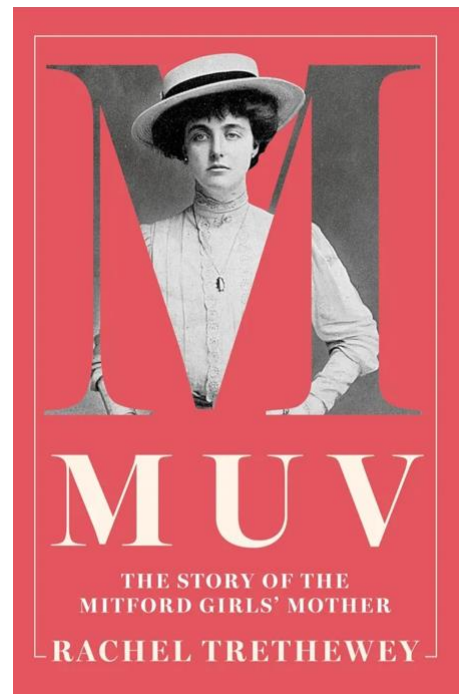
